The achievements of Secondary School Students depending on Parents Educational level- A case study of Berhampore Sub-Division in Murshidabadb District

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ABSTRACT

At the secondary level of education, the effect of parental education level on the academic achieving of students and to focus that effect the study was conducted. The study is board of intermediate and secondary education. The interview, observation and question paper were for fortes study. This article tries to search the effect of parental education status. On academic success of students in secondary school level. The production of the research was students of various government and non-government high school in Berhampore Sub-division. As randomly sampled, 200 students was taken in tenth grade. The null hypothesis was formulated and analysis using impendent z text, the text was done. The text was done based on empirical data, and describing the descriptive study to correlate variables. After analyzing the data the research finds significant positive correlation between parental education status and students' academic achieving.

The education has a great role in forming the character of the nation as well as the individual. [kolman at al 1966] parental education is considered to be the most stable[permanent] aspect of socio-economic status. It is well defend that family plays an important role for a child's academic an achievement and development [karnel of gross, 1987]. Thompson at all [1988] said that, mother 's level of education affects the beliefs in adolescent educational outcome expectation using data the NEAP indicated a survey that in higher parental education level report, the average score of student was high. However, parental education is a special case and in many area of world there is a lot of research on its effect. Special region Sub-division Berhampore, in where the lake of education more than other Sub-division of West Bengal. According to Pakistan bureau of statistics[1988 census] the literacy rate of this area is around 21%. Area under present study considered as a backward are. In present research education focuses on backwardness and scarcity of resources. This may prove the result otherwise.

Karshen (2003) said that, student whose parents are well educated get higher positions than those parents are not educated. The educated parent's helps they are child in their school work activity. Dave & Dave (1971) noticed that, hi achiever achievers are related with higher education level of their parents. Who are unsuccessful students, level of their parental education is low. Williams (1980) and Teachman (1987) also notice that the educated parents make such an environment that gives an opportunity of learning. They involved themselves in their children school activities and school environment. Okagaki and French (1978) studied that the parental education is a remote indicator, which is indirectly connected with children's education attainment.

Good & Brophy (1997) say that, educated parents show interest towards their Children's academic performance and they collaborate with education administrators so that children insure rigor in their studies. On the other hand, Hawkes (1995) States that , student's performance does not depend on the parental professional skills or , educational attainment. The literature review indicating a positive and significant relationship between the parental education level and student's Academic achievement. The researcher of this study is this particular backward and in less educated areas of the district, they try to find out a relation between the level of parental education and student's academic achievement.

METHODOLOGY

This survey covers the area of Berhampore Sub-division of West Bengal. The population of the study is the students of Government and non-government secondary school. As a sample, they are selected 300 students of grade A at random. Data has been collected by questionnaire, interview and direct observation. Documentation of 9 grade student result was analyzed. Evaluation was finished by questionnaire, educational psychology and the Expert of department of educational administration. Its reliability is quite high that indicates the high level of internal consistency. Observation was also used to verify information collected and collect data that was completely through interview and personal questionnaires. Students assist independently under the close supervision of the researcher and the close supervision of the research and as necessary.

In interview, the student's performance was observed by their response. Independent Z test analysis is used to ascertain the effect of parental education level on student's academic achievement. Z test is used to compare with high and low level of parental education and average score of student's performance. 4.38 was the object Z value. The value was tested for significance buy compared with the critical value at the buy compared with the critical value at the 0.05 level. The value obtained was higher than the critical value. The result shows that the Academic background of parents has a significant positive effect on academic education of the students of secondary school.

They argue that, in most cases, students' academic success does not depend on the parental educational level. Example- In his research, Hawkes concluded about educational attainment of parents that it does not affect students' academic achievement.

CONCLUSION

In this research study, it is concluded that highly educated parents have more influence on them. At secondary school level children achieve success in their studies and as well. This film is supported by the fact that usually during middle school, highly educated parents take their children's Academic performance, and subject and they show interest and care in carries choice.
